Reception/Year 1:

Reception and Year 1 have had a lovely first week back! We have been finishing off our focus on water and rivers to get ready for our class assembly on the 24th June! We read the story 'A River' by Marc Martin, a beautifully written book. The children loved the idea of a river adventure, so we made our own little boats by scrunching tin foil, and thought about the journey we would have. Everyone wrote their adventure ideas down! We used the story to inspire 'wow' words and the children came up with word like 'drifting' and 'shimmering'. As part of our Learning for Life, we read 'The River' by Tom Percival, which compares the journey of a river to our feelings and emotions. It gave us a good chance to talk about our emotions again (and we linked it back to the Colour Monster work we did at the start of the year!) The river stories have inspired our eco-mural which is now in full swing. We do still need lots of 'river coloured' (greens, blues) recycling that would be suitable for weaving. Year 2/3:

What a brilliant first week back we have had in Year 2/3! In Maths, the children have started our measurement topic focusing on the length and perimeter unit. The whole class have had the opportunity to explore and use different pieces of equipment used in length and have being measuring inside and outside the classroom. As well as this, the children have been learning about the equivalence in mm, cm and m. They have also practised comparing different lengths. In English, the class have written their own narrative this week inspired by *My Name is Not* Refugee called My Name is Not New Kid exploring what life would be like being a new pupil at a school. The children had to write in 1st person and past tense based on the work they did before half term. In Science, we have continued our light topic, learning about how light travels from sources and how it reflects of surfaces. The children also learnt about sun safety and how to protect their eyes and skin during the summer months. In Art, the children moved onto their new topic looking at small world and practised scaling up and down images to help understand perspective. Finally, in PE, the children started learning about rounders. They practised their bat and ball skills as well as throwing and catching to help develop their fielding.

Year 4/5:

Year 4/5 have had a very busy week indeed!

In Maths, the class have started learning about how to convert between units of time; for example, hours to minutes or minutes to seconds. They have also worked on converting between years, months, weeks and days. Later in the week the class recapped how to convert between analogue and digital times, focusing on 12 hour clock time. They then moved on to 24 hour clock time. Any extra practice at home will certainly help your child - after all, clocks are all around us!

In PE this week the class have been learning how to play rounders. They have learned where to throw the ball tactically in a game of rounders according to where a batter is running towards. They practised this through typical bat-ball rounders and 'kick rounders'.

The class have spent time this week putting together their presentations ready for the sharing assembly today. Hopefully many of you are able to make it and if you're reading this after school and did come along, we hope you enjoyed it! The groups worked really hard to put together their own script and were very excited to share!

Our new class book for this half-term is 'My Friend Walter' by Michael Morpurgo. They voted between three books, having read the blurbs and part of the first chapters and Michael Morpurgo won (the class do seem to like stories involving ghosts!!). We will be also starting our new English topic next week, focusing on Macbeth by Shakespeare!

A note about reading books: all children in year 4/5 are able to take a book home from the classroom library. For many, (free readers), this will be their main reading book. Unfortunately we have had one or two books go missing from the bookshelf, so please encourage your child(ren) to check their book collections for any books that may belong to school, and please to bring them back in for others to enjoy.
