A message from the Headteacher;

As I type, I can hear our friends in Year 2 and 3 preparing for this afternoon's 'open assembly' and I suspect those families coming to watch later today are in for a real treat! We know finding time in the working day to attend such events can be tricky and we thank you, as ever, for your support and attendance.

Mrs Pear's class weren't the only ones preparing to 'tread the boards' this week and it has been nice to see Year 6 making the initial preparations for their July performance. Whilst in Year 4/5 there has been some lovely work based on the art of Hokusai and his Japanese landscapes. Reception and Year 1 however, have been going even further back in time to look at the dinosaurs!

One unfortunate theme that has been mentioned by a number of staff members over recent weeks has been an increase in pupils using inappropriate and offensive language. Reception/Year 1 Class News,

The dinosaurs arrived in Reception and Year 1 this week! We received a 'letter' from a senior palaeontologist from UCL asking for the children's input into the university's dinosaur records, so the children have been busy researching and writing about dinosaurs they know! After reading the story 'Tyrannosaurus Drip', we found out about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

In phonics, Year 1 have been enjoying their reading, consolidating sounds and practising writing red words. Reception have learnt the new digraph /ay/ may I play and have been reading and writing words with the sound in.

In Maths, Reception have been exploring doubles, for example, 2+2. Year 1 have continued thinking about equal groups, but presented as arrays, which is a uniform pattern of equal groups, for example, eggs in an egg box or panes in a window frame.

You may have seen from our seesaw posts that the children have enjoyed Maypole dancing this week, which we will be continuing! They have also enjoyed their music session with Mrs Moulds and PE with Dan!

Year 2/3 Class News,

Our main drive of the week has been planning and preparing our Sharing Assembly. With just a little guidance, the children planned their topics in small groups and have put a lot of effort into rehearsals. There were a few chaotic Nativity flashbacks and some deep breaths taken but we're sure they'll make you proud! We'll see you at 3pm in the hall.

The sun shone as we had a fabulous afternoon of fresh air and exercise on Wednesday, followed (for many class members) by tennis at Dan's summer sports club. The children enjoyed using poster paints to mix colours and complete their versions of Hockney's 'A Bigger Splash'.

In Maths we've enjoyed learning about measuring liquid in ml and litres, understanding the terms 'capacity' and 'volume', and reading a variety of scales. The Y3 got quite wet whilst pouring and filling unscaled containers to calculate their capacity; luckily we made a pre-emptive decision to take this activity outside!

In English we've continued with our 'Charlie' playscript, practising using inverted commas and learning about brackets. The Year 2 have revised some of their grammar and spelling, looking again at past, present and future tenses as well as exclamation, statement and question sentences. They have begun their SATs and are taking it in their stride. Just another day at the office! However, if any children do feel worried at home, please reassure them that these tests are just like our termly ones, to show us what to plan next and are only seen by their teachers. A few good nights of sleep between now and Wednesday would be much appreciated, as there will be a few busy days next week!

A quick reminder to please provide a drinks bottle, sunhat, shorts and apply sun cream before school. We do have a selection of caps to borrow but not all children are keen to wear them! In addition, pack ups cannot be refrigerated and our busy classroom is warm, so the addition of a small ice pack or partially frozen drinks bottle would be ideal.

Year 4/5 Class News,

In English this week we have enjoyed writing original, detailed similes. We used the word banks created last week to compose fantastic similes with an eerie feel. We then used these to compose our own poetry based on the sea.

We have been exploring the 'i before e except after c' rule and the rules for adding the suffix -tion, -sion, -ssion and -cian to words to create nouns. We also practised our summarising skills in our reading comprehension and practised a range of skills using an interesting extract from the book 'One Million Insects'.

In Maths year 4 have been working with money and relating this to their previous learning on decimals. We have all been working on adding and subtracting decimals as well as ordering and comparing decimals.

Later in the week we started a unit on geometry, understanding angles as turns and types of angles such as obtuse, acute and reflex.

We have continued to work on our hurdle and relay techniques in PE and have created our own card mechanisms in Design and Technology.

We started a new Art unit this week, looking at the works of Hokusai and his 36 views of Mount Fuji. We discussed what we liked or disliked about his work 'The Great Wave', how we would describe the different elements of the artwork and began to discuss how we might create it ourselves.

In Computing this week we used 'Scratch' to program algorithms to make a 'sprite' dance! We explored how we can use loop blocks to repeat actions until stopped.

Using our investigative skills in Science we found out how temperature effects how quickly chocolate melts and used our knowledge of particles in solids, liquids and gases to explain this.
