Reception/Year 1 Class News,

Reception and Year 1 have had a lovely week in the sunshine this week! At the beginning of the week, we came across an old suitcase in the middle of the classroom. We spent some time using the words 'see', 'think' and 'wonder' to try and work out what it was! There were some insightful, but also imaginative, ideas as to who the suitcase belonged to and even, what might be inside it!! When we finally opened it later, there were some old black&white and sepia seaside holiday photographs... they continued to inspire lots of discussion and debate! Over the week, we moved on to reading the story 'Peepo' to discuss similarities and differences from the past to today!

In Drawing Club, we have used the traditional tale 'The Gingerbread Man' this week and have had lots of fun with it! On Wednesday, the old lady baked a new character 'the stinky cheese man' and we all drew what we though the new character would look like!!

In art, we explored charcoal and the effects we could create with it. We then used our new skills to produce observational drawings of feather in our sketchbooks!

In phonics this week, Year 1 have completed the Year 1 Phonics Screen and have been enjoying this week's new reading book.

Reception have learnt the new digraph /ow/ blow the snow, whilst recapping on the other sounds so far! In Maths, Reception have been exploring number patterns and thinking about doubles! Year 1 have continued their focus on fractions, investigating quarters.

As part of our summer PE, we have continued to practise our maypole dancing and the children are really getting the hang of it now! The skipping is fantastic and I know that lots of them have been practising at home!! Of course, we have also been very busy preparing for a special day on Sunday, so please look out for some surprise heading your way!

This week's home learning:

- -Read your school reading book at least three times and record in your journal! If you can read it five times, then even better!
- -Stay in the yellow on Doodlemaths, but reach for the green zone! (Please make sure that your child is completing this as we are currently the class with the lowest participation in school!)
- Year 1 have a DoodleSpell assignment focusing on red words.

Year 2/3 Class News,

In our core curriculum this week we have planned and started writing our stories in English, as well as revising some grammar to help us write interesting sentences. Our Maths has been more work on Time, practising reading and writing to the 5 minutes on an analogue clock, working out durations of time and, for some, comparing analogue with digital time (am/pm).

Earlier in the week we explored some objects from around the home, such as oven gloves, fire blankets, first aid kits and plug in night lights, thinking in groups about how they can help keep us safe. As part of our Health & Wellbeing topic we learned about everyday risks in the home and how we can minimise these to keep safe (such as not tampering with electrical items or cleaning products). The children were very knowledgeable and had some great ideas of their own! In our Science lesson we continued our work on nutrition, thinking about what food constitutes a healthy, 'balanced' meal and the Y3 investigated which nutrients we receive from certain foods. We have learned some more French names for sports, such as le natation for swimming and l'escalade for rock climbing, then played a game of Bingo to reinforce our knowledge.

We've now planned our route around Cliffe as part of our Geography work this term and hope to use the maps we've made as soon as the weather cools off slightly... In Art we have been practising our colour mixing skills using our own palettes with small amounts of primary colours and white paint – this is harder than you think! Despite the heat making the children (and staff!) uncomfortable and tire more easily, they have continued to try their best at all these tasks and deserve a chilled-out weekend laid in a paddling pool eating ice lollies! Please do continue with suncream, sunhats and fresh water bottles next week, as the warmth is set to continue...

Year 4/5 Class News,

Another busy week in Year 4/5! This week in English the children have identified the features of a balanced discussion and recorded these on a planning sheet in preparation for our writing next week. We have also practised writing sentences in the present perfect form and using a range of formal conjunctions. The children then used what they had learned to write a paragraph supporting a viewpoint, either: Banksy is a vandal or Banksy is an artist.

In Maths the Year 4 have focused on improving their rapid recall of the multiplication tables and have also worked on estimating money. Year 5 have worked on adding and subtracting decimals and whole numbers as well as decimal sequences. Later in the week Year 4 made posters of the different types of triangles: isosceles, scalene and equilateral triangles and recapped parallel and perpendicular lines. Year 5 practised using a protractor to measure obtuse angles.

In DT we have created a protype for our mechanical poster and have used this to identify any changes that need to be made to our final piece.

In Science we have interpreted the results collected from our evaporation investigation last week and written conclusions on what this shows. We have also started our new Science topic on "Changing Materials" by identifying the properties of different materials and the definitions for these.

As part of our Geography and Science topic 'Wonderful Water', this week we learned all about how the water cycle works. We made water cycles 'in a bag' to show the cycle actually happening, and we created drama sequences demonstrating the different stages. On Friday we created our own water cycle 'flap books' to consolidate our learning and describe the processes in writing.

In Art this week we finished our 'Great Wave' pieces, selecting media and tools to create the waves. They will be on display on Seesaw soon!
