Reception and Year 1 Class News:

Reception and Year 1 have had a fabulous week! We slipped straight back into our routines this week and the children have been amazing! Reception have begun reading short ditties together, sounding out the words and practising their blending. We have had fun with the ditty themes, making up our own poems and writing! Reception's maths focus has been 3D shapes and the children have been exploring the properties of 3D shapes by building and rolling them. Year 1 have learnt a new suffix 'tious'/ 'cious' so they watched the song 'Truly Scrumptious' from Chitty Chitty Bang Bang and have started to design their own 'delicious' doughnuts! Year 1's maths focus has been weight and mass. They have done a lot of practical work to compare and measure mass in the outdoor area!

Our class book has been 'Egg Drop' by Mini Grey (who also wrote Traction Man!) and the children thought of alternative endings, creating storyboards, and they also completed a STEM activity to design protection for a boiled egg! We have been enjoying our outdoor spaces, continuing our large scale 'Rainbow Forest' art project and exploring our nature kitchen!

Home learning this week is to enjoy your home reading books at least three times (and practise the green/ red words inside the front cover) and try to complete 10 minutes of Doodlemaths each day (to stay in the green zone!)

Year 2 and 3 Class News:

We have had a wonderful week filled with lots of exciting lessons! In English, we have been building up to writing a diary entry based on an animation called 'The Lighthouse'. Everyone produced great entries and tried hard with their writing. In Maths, we finished our geometry topic by looking at the properties of 3D shapes as a whole class. We have now moved onto fractions and over the next week, we will be looking at finding and recognising a half and quarter. We have also been doing some Maths and English assessments this week and everybody has worked extremely hard. As a result, in the afternoons we have had some more active lessons. In PE, we have done an agility course and dance lessons. This allowed everyone to get moving and have some fun! In history, we have continued looking at the history of our local area by looking at how Joseph Roundtree helped the people of York and the Roman settlement of York. Finally, we have all enjoyed a little bit of red nose day fun by sharing jokes with each other! We have had a brilliant week, and everyone is settling in fantastically! Year 4 and 5 Class News:

This week in English we have created fantastic posters about Tigers. We have used a combination of our home learning and new research to find out about Tigers and compose a non-chronological report which we have edited and published as colourful posters. On Thursday, the children watched various charity awareness adverts and analysed the use of emotive language in each, before having a go at their own emotive phrases around dangers to tigers.

In Maths we have worked hard on ordering fractions with a real focus on finding equivalent fractions. We then learned how to add and subtract fractions, including with mixed denominators for those more confident.

In Science we have grouped and classified vertebrates, looking at the similarities and differences of the different groups. Also, we looked at classification of animals using classification keys. We have found out about Britain's first railways and located these on a map.

We had a great music lesson with Mrs Moulds playing the ukulele. This week the children learned how to play and sing along to 'Kookaburra'.

On Friday we celebrated Comic Relief by learning about Ethan who suffers with Cerebral Palsy. We discussed how the donations help to raise funds and had a go at various comic relief activities. Homework: Doodle Maths/English and reading 3x a week.

Year 6 Class News:

In Active maths we had to run in a relay to get cards and bring them back to our team to work them out. In English and Art we wrote up our poems and used oil pastels to make our backgrounds.
